Submission of an appeal is not a guarantee of additional funding and does not prevent a financial hold being placed on the student account. 	 While appeals will be reviewed on a rolling basis, a majority of decisions regarding need-based institutional eligibility will not begin until at least April. We will make every attempt to respond to you by your admission deposit deadline*, however, you should not wait for appeal results to make your enrollment decision. Decisions on appeals received after 5/1 will follow the Returning Student Policy (see box to the left).
