1. Off-Campus Housing

4. Identification Card Information

- Once admitted to a program and all paperwork is submitted, all graduate students can receive an ID card at the PC Card Office (Harkins Hall, Room 401) between 8:30AM and 4:30PM, Monday through Friday. - ID cards are free of charge when first issued
- Your ID card can be used to check out library books, for printing and making copies on-campus, to make purchases on-campus and at specified off-campus venues, and to use the RIPTA bus line.
 - **Note:** You must add money to "PC Cash Accounts" in order to use your card for making purchases.
